On March 2 – Ash Wednesday – we entered into the season of Lent. I love the season of Lent (I know; I know – I say that about every season of the church year)! But I really do love Lent. I love how it invites us to reflect honestly about where we are with God, with ourselves and with the rest of the world. I love that during Lent, we get to ask the real questions, the tough questions: questions

about sin and righteousness, forgiveness and reconciliation, suffering and redemption, life and death.

Job is someone who suffers. A lot. But Job is never afraid to cry out "Why?" to the heavens. Job is not ashamed to make his complaints known to God; he's not embarrassed about demanding an answer from the Almighty.

Job, in other words, is someone who doesn't shy away from the hard questions.

We could learn a thing or two from listening to Job. So for the five weeks of Lent leading up to Palm Sunday, that's just what we're going to do. Listen to Job. Engage with the tensions in Job's life and in our own. Like Job, we will be asked to be honest about our doubts, and our faith; our light, and our darkness. Like Job, we will be invited to stay open to the Spirit of God through it all.

Please join us for worship on Sundays at 10 am, and also for our Lenten evening services – held on Wednesdays during Lent at 7:30 pm. During our Wednesday evening services, and also for Palm Sunday and Holy Week, the Greenwich Church Music series will feature beautiful, talented artists from our community and beyond (see the article on pg. 3 for details) to help us engage even more fully with the depth of the season.

In all of this – in our music, in our hearing of the Word, in our prayers, sighs and silences – may God bless our Lenten season, drawing us even closer to our God, who walks with us in the light, and walks with us in the darkness.

Welcome to worship at Old Greenwich Presbyterian Church!

We are so glad you are worshipping with us — whether in-person or online! We continue to stream online services even as we gather in person.

The Session has again reviewed our protocols for indoor worship and building use and unanimously approves:

- Beginning on Sunday, March 13, Old Greenwich Presbyterian Church will change to "Mask Optional" for all indoor facility use, including worship services. The change means that attendees of an indoor event, including worship services, are not required to wear a mask while indoors. However, all are free to do so if they wish; and
- We strongly suggest that those who are not vaccinated should continue to wear a mask for their own protection and that of the congregation; and
- For some additional period, we will continue to maintain social distancing for indoor events as much as reasonably possible, including by continuing the seating for Sunday services only in every other row, and by encouraging the attendees to spread out within those rows; and
- We will continue to enter through the Green Room to reduce crowding; and
- Decisions related to masking, positioning and social distancing for the choir will be made by Pastor Mary Beth, Tom and Betsy; and
- We will continue to reevaluate the situation over the coming weeks and provide additional updates.

Fellowship will resume on Sunday, March 6. You may pick up food and/or drinks in Memorial Hall, but we encourage you to go outside for eating and fellowshipping;

As we want to keep the air moving and ventilated as much as possible (which will include some open doors and windows), keep that in mind as you dress for worship;

If you are feeling ill in any way, please join us virtually.



PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN

We are continuing our new study on **Tuesday, March 15, at 11:30 am**, live in the church in the room behind the pastor's office in Trinity Wing. We'll meet the third Tuesday of each month. We could Zoom you if you're not up to in-person meetings. There are nine lessons, but other than the two chapters on Mary, one woman is lifted up and you could drop in when you're free and not worry about continuity. The authors DVD will be used and introduces each session.

What My Grandmothers Taught Me; Learning from the women in Matthew's Genealogy of Jesus, the PW study written by Merryl Blair, will be used. Here's a glimpse: "people hade often been intrigued by the appearance of five women in the genealogy of Jesus. Explore who these women are, discover their stories, examine the challenges and choices they faced, and consider what contributions each made to the ancestral line of Jesus. In the process, hear the author's invitation to learn from their example and be inspired to call on God to empower our own witness and action despite challenging circumstances in our own times."

"What do the following women have in common? A woman who acted as a prostitute to be faithful to her family, a prostitute, a foreign immigrant, a woman 'taken' for a man's sexual pleasure, an unwed mother who flees as a refugee."

Yep, they are in the bible, in the genealogy. If you never looked at them as was just described, come let's investigate those claims together.

You're invited to bring a picture of a family wedding, a picture of your grandma or woman of another generation who made a difference in your life, an old church cookbook or grandma's favorite recipe or ANYTHING (like needlework) she may have taught you! Pastor Mary Beth may be leading during March, discussing Tamar.

I will be ordering books and having them ready for you ahead. Or you could order yours from Presbyterianwomen.org (click on store). If you're only free in the evenings let me know and perhaps, we could plan for something at night.
