Faithful Doubt

Have you ever heard it said that "doubt is the opposite of faith?" I heard that, or something along those lines, growing up quite a bit, and I still hear it some: that if we *really* believe in God, if we are *truly* faithful Christians, then there is simply no room for doubt. Sometimes, it seems to me, we imagine faith and doubt as if they were mutually exclusive — that if you have one, you can't have the other.

As I shared with you during one of our recent Sunday worship services, I never knew until I studied Hebrew in seminary that *there is no word in the Biblical Hebrew language for "doubt."* Out of all those words in our Hebrew Bible (and there are *a lot* of words!), there is not a single one for "doubt."

Now, this means something. It means that what we call "doubt," our Bible calls "faith." Our questions, our anger, our fears, our pain, our wondering how in the world any of this makes sense — all of that — is not doubt at all, but faith.

If you've been worshipping with us for Lent, this will sound familiar. We have seen all throughout this season how even the most faithful among us have our doubts — and big doubts, at that. We have seen a man named Job — one of the most righteous people there is — lose everything: land, servants, animals, and most devastatingly of all, his children. And Job, we have witnessed, in his great faithfulness, has had no problem expressing his grief, his anger, his questions, his... great, big *doubt*... about it all.

So, Greenwich Church, I wonder: what if what we call "doubt" is really faith, or a key part of faith? What if when we feel doubt (and despair, and anger), it doesn't mean that there is something wrong with us at all? What if, instead, our doubts put us in the company of Job, of the Psalmist, of Jesus crying out on the cross: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

I'm so grateful that we are journeying through this season of Lent together — a truth-telling season, indeed. Please continue to journey with us as we enter into Holy Week.

We are offering a Maundy Thursday (April 14) 7:30PM service; a Good Friday (April 15) 7:30 pm service; a Holy Saturday event for children (April 16) at 10 am; and, of course, Easter Sunday (10 am) on April 17!

In life and in death, through our faithful doubts and our wildest hopes, I believe with every breath of my being that God is molding us more fully into the people that God intends for us to be.






