

THE HISTORY OF THE CHRISMON

Chrismons are "monograms of Christ." At OGPC, we have been placing Chrismons on our trees for many years. These monograms became more popular on a Christmas tree after Frances Kipps Spencer, a member of the Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, VA took the concept to decorate the sanctuary in 1957. The first Chrismons were made of leftover wrapping paper and each year she added more.

The Chrismon tree is highly symbolic, conveying the Life of Christ and the meaning of Christmas through commonly found items and easily understood symbols borrowed or modified from other sources. The tree is an Evergreen, representing eternal life and decorated with traditional and modified ancient Christian symbols called Chrismons. The word Christmas comes from a combination of Christ's monograms. Chrismons are normally made by members of local congregations in colors of white and gold.

Today the Sunday School children will "school" you in the symbolism and meanings of various Chrismons which will then be placed on our Christmas tree.

The things we get *for* Christmas will not last as long as the things we get *from* Christmas. Why do we light the Advent candles?

The first Advent candle is the candle of Hope. Jesus is our hope. He died on the cross to save us and give us everlasting life. "The light of hope shines in the darkness and the darkness has never put it out."

We light this candle for Hope.

The second candle is the candle of Peace. Jesus is our peace. His peace is deep within us, reaches out to friends and strangers and brings justice to our world.

We light this Candle for Peace.

The third candle is the candle of Joy. Jesus is our joy. The joy of Christ deep within us can help us reach out to the sad, the suffering and the lonely.

We light this candle for Joy.

The fourth candle is the candle of love. Jesus is our love. He is with us always and loves us unconditionally through all the events in our lives - in birth and death, in joy and sorrow.

We light this candle for Love.

The Holy Trinity

This is the symbol for the Holy Trinity. God is one God, but there are three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We know there are three persons in the Trinity from God's word in Matthew 28:19: "Go and make disciples of all Nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." All three sides joined together to form one figure. This shows the unity of the Trinity.

The Creator Star

This is called the Creator Star. God the Father created the world in six days. That is why the star has six points. The star is born by joining two triangles together. All three persons of the Trinity were present at the creation of the world, even though it was the work of God the Father to create it. Some have also used the six points of the star refer to the six attributes of God the Father - power, wisdom, majesty, love, mercy, and justice.

Our lives are busy and full of so many things pulling us in all different directions, let us take this moment to confess our sins to God in unison.

The Chi-Rho- Christ

Symbols that point us to Jesus. One of the most common symbols is the Chi- Rho, the letters join together to form a monogram like we talked about earlier. They are the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ- Christos. The Greek letters are pronounced Chi row. Now every time I see this symbol, I know that it stands for Christ.

The Fish (Jesus our Savior)

Most ancient symbol for our Lord and was used as an easily recognized secret sign by the early Christians. The Greek word for fish, Exos, is formed by using the first letter of each of the words in Greek which stands for Jesus Christ, Son of God, savior. The image of the fish offered protection from persecution. In the catacombs, fish were drawn on the walls to direct worshippers to meeting places. Seeing the symbol today we can remember a time when Christians were routinely persecuted for their beliefs and how they succeeded and spreading the gospel, despite all these obstacles

The Manger

The Cross

What is the greatest symbol of the Christian Church? Without Jesus's death on the cross, we would be forever lost. The cross carries such great significance - over 400 forms of the Cross have been designed. Of these, about 50 have been used in Christian symbolism. You will see many different crosses on our tree.

The Crown

The crown symbolizes Jesus as our King. He is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. He rules over the heavens and the earth. The crown also reminds us that someday we will also receive the Crown of Life when we go to heaven. Revelation 2:10 says: "Be faithful even to the point of death and I will give you the Crown of Life."

The Dove and the Flame

The dove reminds us that our souls go to heaven, just as Jesus did when he left the earth. It is also a symbol of peace, befitting the Prince of Peace. The Holy Spirit, which descended when Christ was baptized by John the Baptist, is also represented by the dove. When the dove came, the voice of God from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased," as the Holy Spirit descended on Christ in the form of a dove.

The Word - The Lamp and Candle

God's holy word is depicted in several ways. Many times, it is symbolized with an open book. Sometimes, it is also symbolized by the lamp. The symbolism stems from the words of Psalm 119 which says, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path." The candle also symbolizes the word as it lights our way and shows us the true path.

The Shell - Our Baptism

We are brought to faith through our baptism. The shell is a symbol for baptism since it reminds us of the water used when we are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. The miracle of God making us his children through this holy sacrament.

The Chalice - Communion

The usual symbol for the Lord's Supper is a chalice with a host or wafer rising out of it. Sometimes the letters I. N. R. I. or I. H. C. are imprinted on the wafer. This symbolizes Jesus saying "Take, eat, this is my blood. Do this in remembrance of me."
