

SCRIPTURE READING – John 1:1-14 ("The Message" translation)

The Word was first, the Word present to God, God present to the Word. The Word was God, in readiness for God

from day one. Everything was created through him; nothing - not one thing! - came into being without him. What came into existence was Life, and the Life was Light to live by. The Life-Light blazed out of the darkness; the darkness couldn't put it out.
