We See the Light!

Contrary to popular belief, Christmas is not just one day – it's twelve days! It's a season, actually, from December 25 to the Day of Epiphany (which means "light"), and it always falls on January 6 (which also just happens to be my son Wil's birthday!).

Did you know that, in the early church, the day of Epiphany was even more important than Christmas day itself? That's hard to imagine, isn't it? But it's true. Historically-speaking, Epiphany has always been an important day in the church – one of *the* most important.

So, what, exactly, is *our* "epiphany?" What is our light? **The church's epiphany is that, in Christ, God is intent on saving** *all* **of creation.** Jesus of Nazareth, God-in-the-flesh, is not just for us, not just for the so-called "chosen ones." No; Jesus is for the whole world –for the stranger, the alien, the foreigner, the other, the outsider. *Jesus is for all of creation.* God, in Christ, has a plan - not just for us, but for all the world.

...And that means evangelism. Yes, the "e" word! I know that word may make a lot of us nervous. But let's be clear: I'm not talking about bullying and blustering and harassing people into the kingdom of God. There is another way, the way that Jesus shared the Good News with others. Jesus never bullied or intimidated or begged people to believe. He just came alongside them in their suffering and said, "I have some good news. God loves you, and wants to make you well. Yes, even you."

The church could do that. We at Old Greenwich could do that. This world is such a broken place. Even in our local communities, there are so many broken people, so many hurting and lost people. Addictions. Depression. Hopelessness. Fear. Grief. Loneliness. We all know that all of this is out there, and not so very far away. We probably all know people for whom these things are an every-day reality.

So, what if we started telling our friends and our neighbors: "Our God loves you and wants to make you well. Yes, even you." We could seek out the suffering and the outcast, the least and the lost, and tell them, "Our God and our Gospel is for you. Yes, even you." The church could say, again and again, to every single person, "This is for you. This good news is for you! So, come practice it with us. Come *live it* with us. You are welcome here!"

What if we could do that? What if we could share our epiphany with the world? Grace and Peace,
