

*OPENING HYMN "Siyahamb' ekukhanyeni kwenkos" / "We Are Marching in the Light of God"

First verse: Choir only All remaining verses: Congregation!

"Siyahamba" is a Zulu chorus that emerged out of a rural Protestant congregation, possibly in the former Natal province of South Africa. The chorus probably existed in an oral form for years, although the authors of the melody and of the Zulu lyrics are unknown. The lyrics, with their biblical imagery of walking in the divine light, is likely inspired by Methodist or Pentecostal hymns. Although "Siyahamba" has been associated with the anti-apartheid movement in south Africa, it was not composed originally as a protest song. However, after its introduction to Europe and the US by Anders Nyberg in the 1980s, it has been used in the international effort to end the regime of racial discrimination in South Africa. Nowadays, "Siyahamba" is viewed both locally and internationally as a liberation song.
