LISTENING TO GOD THROUGH POETRY

During the season of Lent, Elders Katie Rienzo and Abbie Conlon, along with Pastor Mary Beth, are co-facilitating a weekly poetry group. In this one-hour session, we listen for the voice of God through the art of the poem, exploring themes such as doubt, faith, love, grief and identity.

Below is a poem we read together during our first session. As part of a Lenten invitation, I invite you to read and reflect upon it, too.

Irish poet Pádraig Ó Tuama has written three “collects,” which are prayers people pray together, usually during a worship service. A collect typically includes five parts: invocation, acknowledgement, petition, aspiration and pleading. Do you see these five parts in the poem below? What reactions do you have when you read Ó Tuama’s poem? Try reading it aloud (as collects are meant to be read aloud, “collectively”). Does reading the prayers/poem aloud change what you hear? What about reading it aloud with someone else? Do you hear it differently once again? What does this poem say about faith? About doubt? What does it tell us about ourselves? What does it tell us about God?

To explore questions like these in a group, consider joining us at an upcoming session (each session stands alone). We meet on the Thursdays in March (March 16, 23 and 30) from 6:30 to 7:25 pm.

May God bless us during this season of Lent as we listen together for God’s words and wisdom through the holy art of poetry.

No firearms of any kind are allowed on OGPC property except for police and security personnel. This policy covers the building (Sanctuary, Memorial Hall, Trinity Wing, etc.) and all OGPC owned land around it. The NO GUN POLICY statement, adopted by Session reads:

OGPC GUN FREE POLICY

On January 16, 2023 at a regularly scheduled meeting, the Session of Old Greenwich Presbyterian Church voted unanimously to establish the land and facility of Old Greenwich Church to be a gun free zone. From thenceforth, it is the determination of the Session that NO FIREARMS of any kind will be allowed anywhere on church property at any time except as carried, maintained or under the control of active duty police and qualified and permitted retired police or designated security guards. This policy applies to all people who enter upon the property of the church including but not limited to church staff, members and friends, all guests, private contractors and delivery people, and all who use the church facility for authorized purposes including but not limited to Greenwich Nursery School, Alcoholics Anonymous, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and any other persons, groups, or organizations who may use church land or facilities for their own purposes whether or not authorized by the church.

Violators of this policy will be subject to removal and/or arrest by the police.

MAKING ROOM FOR GOD

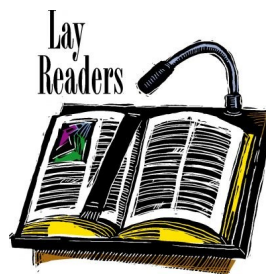

LENTEN PER CAPITA INVITATION

If you are like me, you often struggle during Lent to come up with something to give up. Whether it be sweets or morning coffees, it can be difficult to choose something to stick with. The Discipleship Committee would like to invite you to join us in a Lenten Per Capita challenge. For the 40 days of Lent, we would like you to consider “giving up” a dollar a day to go towards your per capita pledge. (As a reminder, the per capita is the price per member our church pays towards our wider denomination). The 2023 amount per person is \$42.50, so by putting \$40 away throughout Lent, you will have basically fulfilled your per capita amount. Last year, our church raised around \$3,000 in per capita pledges; but no matter how much we raise, we are committed to paying the full amount because we believe our connections to one another and to the wider church are holy, necessary and good!

Let's come together this Lenten season to help our church to thrive with the full support of our per capita pledges (which is around \$13,000). There are countdown calendars located in the back of the sanctuary (narthex) for you to put on your fridge to track your progress throughout Lent. 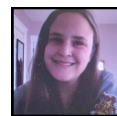

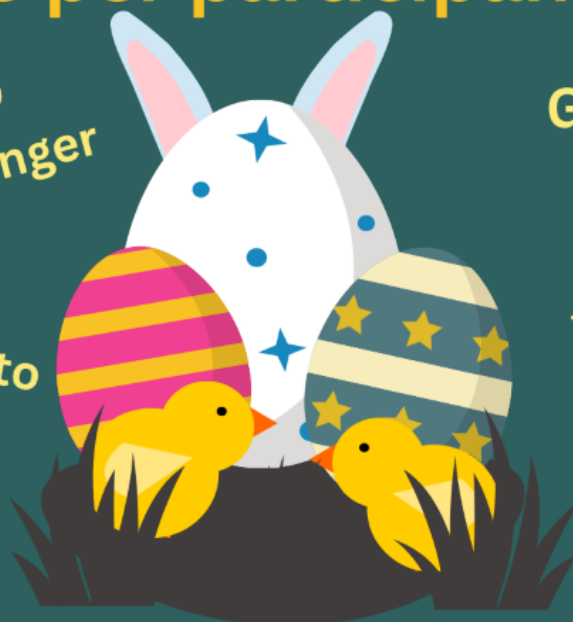

Syria-Turkey Earthquake
