"Chosen"

At the end of the Gospel according to John, Jesus says to his disciples: "You did not choose me, but I chose you."You did not choose me, but I chose you. Wow. What a powerful promise!

A beautiful, and moving, way we recently saw this promise played out was through the baptism of Esperanza Jane Ahart on Sunday, April 23. Esperanza was too young to make the decision to be baptized herself, and so it was her family who brought her to the waters at the font, reminding all of us that even when we have *no idea* as to what is going on, God claims us anyway, and seals the promise that God will *always* love us: "You did not choose me but I chose you." So says God to Esperanza; so says God to us.

At the end of May, we will celebrate God working and moving in the lives of our confirmands — Mia DiGiovanni, Ellie Mardis-LeCroy, Jackie Miller, Maddie Wayne, Adam Wolfe and Connor Wolfe. We will remind them (and keep reminding them, as many times as it takes!) that no matter where they go, God goes with them. No matter what, God is always there, loving them, calling them home: "You did not choose me but I chose you." So says God to our confirmands; so says God to us.

Many of us have gone through times in our lives when we've wondered where God has been, when we've wondered if God has been really present at all. Many of us have gone through times when we've cried out, more or less in the words of Psalm 22: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Even in our life together at Greenwich, it has sometimes been difficult to know exactly how God has been at work, how God has been leading the church. But Jesus' words come to us, sometimes faintly, sometimes in that still, small voice, "You did not choose me, but I chose you."

We are chosen of God. Even when we don't understand it, even when we forget it, even when we stray from it, we are chosen of God. Chosen to love each other as God loves us. Chosen to serve each other, and our community. Chosen to see and proclaim new life in a world that tells us we are foolish to see and say such things.

"You did not choose me, but I chose you." What a powerful promise! What an awesome responsibility. What an amazing grace.

No firearms of any kind are allowed on OGPC property except for police and security personnel. This policy covers the building (Sanctuary, Memorial Hall, Trinity Wing, etc.) and all OGPC owned land around it. The NO GUN POLICY statement, adopted by Session reads:

OGPC GUN FREE POLICY

On January 16, 2023 at a regularly scheduled meeting, the Session of Old Greenwich Presbyterian Church voted unanimously to establish the land and facility of Old Greenwich Church to be a gun free zone. From thenceforth, it is the determination of the Session that NO FIREARMS of any kind will be allowed anywhere on church property at any time except as carried, maintained or under the control of active duty police and qualified and permitted retired police or designated security guards. This policy applies to all people who enter upon the property of the church including but not limited to church staff, members and friends, all guests, private contractors and delivery people, and all who use the church facility for authorized purposes including but not limited to Greenwich Nursery School, Alcoholics Anonymous, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and any other persons, groups, or organizations who may use church land or facilities for their own purposes whether or not authorized by the church.

Violators of this policy will be subject to removal and/or arrest by the police.
