TODAY WE WELCOME MUSICAL GUESTS, La FIOCCA. This period instrument ensemble was founded by Lewis R. Baratz in 2010. Based in Bucks County, PA, and dedicated to performing music of the late 16th, 17th, and 18th centuries, La Fiocco's regular concert series is in New Hope, PA, and Princeton, NJ. The ensemble has also performed in New York, Boston, and Providence, RI. Over 60 instrumentalists and singers from ten states have performed with La Fiocco. In an effort to create more opportunities for early-career artists, artistic director, Lewis Baratz, has developed a new project, La Fiocco TNG: The Next Generation, a smaller and more agile ensemble, with young artists Nathan Bishop and Elaine Yao as core players. This concert is La Fiocco TNG's debut performance. For more information on La Fiocco and upcoming concerts of the full ensemble, visit www.lafiocco.org.
Nathan Bishop, based in Somerville, NJ, is a graduate of Mason Gross School of the Arts of Rutgers University, where he studied violin with Elena Chernova-Davis, fiddling with Cleek Schrey, and historical performance practice with Rebecca Cypess. He performs in a variety of classical and folk traditions and maintains a residency with his Irish traditional music band Faoileán at Flounder Brewing Co., in Hillsborough. He is currently conductor of Hunterdon Musical Arts' Music for Youth Saturday Strings program, and runs a violin and fiddle studio for students of all ages,
Elaine Yao is a doctoral candidate at Princeton University, where she performs on baroque violin with Early Music Princeton and with various local period ensembles, including La Fiocco. She played baroque violin in La Fiocco's Messiah performance with the choir of Trinity Episcopal Church in Solebury, PA, and in La Fiocco's partnership performance of J. S. Bach's St. John Passion with Princeton Pro Musica. Previously, she focused on solo piano repertoire and chamber music in Chicago, where she worked with the Spektral Quartet, Svetlana Belsky, and Amy Briggs.
Lewis R. Baratz founded La Fiocco in 2010. He has taught music history and theory at Mercer County Community College and Seton Hall University, and currently directs the chamber orchestra and early music ensemble at Lafayette College in Easton, PA. He has performed with numerous early music ensembles, is music director of the Highland Park Recorder Society, and has served on the Boards of the Arts \& Cultural Council of Bucks County, Early Music America, and the Academy of Sacred Drama. As a music historian, he has published more than 20 articles and critical editions.
