### "And Here Is Your Lanyard"

Presbyterian Church

During worship on July 23, we heard the story of Jacob's dream (Genesis 28). Jacob – on the run, afraid for his life – dreams there is a ladder extending up to the heavens, with angels scrambling up and down upon it. God appears to Jacob in his dream, and through the curtains of that dark night, God makes covenant with Jacob. God promises never to leave him, never to forsake him. God promises to be his God, forever.

When Jacob wakes up, he takes the stone he had been sleeping on, sets it up as a pillar, and pours oil all over it. He calls the place "Bethel," which means "House of God." That day, Jacob makes a promise back to God: "All that you give me I will surely give one-tenth to you."

You know... I don't know what motivates Jacob to pour oil on that rock, or promise to give one-tenth of his stuff to God. And sometimes, I have to wonder if it's simply because... he just doesn't know what else to do. Jacob senses God's presence, and is grateful to God – or as grateful as he can be – so he decides to spill some oil onto his rocky pillow as his act of giving back. He doesn't really need that old rock anymore, anyway. Maybe God could use it.

One of my favorite poems is "The Lanyard," by the American Poet Laureate, Billy Collins:

The other day as I was ricocheting slowly off the blue walls of this room

bouncing from typewriter to piano, from bookshelf to an envelope lying on the floor,

I found myself in the "L" section of the dictionary where my eyes fell upon the word, Lanyard.

No cookie nibbled by a French novelist could send one more suddenly into the past.

A past where I sat at a workbench, at a camp by a deep Adirondack lake,

learning how to braid thin plastic strips into a lanyard.

A gift for my mother.

I had never seen anyone use a lanyard.

Or wear one, if that's what you did with them.

But that did not keep me from crossing strand over strand again and again

until I had made a boxy, red and white lanyard for my mother.

She gave me life and milk from her breasts, and I gave her a lanyard.

She nursed me in many a sick room, lifted teaspoons of medicine to my lips,

set cold facecloths on my forehead, then led me out into the airy light

and taught me to walk and swim and I in turn presented her with a lanyard.

"Here are thousands of meals" she said, "and here is clothing and a good education."

"And here is your lanyard," I replied, "which I made with a little help from a counselor."

"Here is a breathing body and a beating heart,

strong legs, bones and teeth and two clear eyes to read the world." she whispered.

"And here," I said, "is the lanyard I made at camp."

"And here," I wish to say to her now, "is a smaller gift. Not the archaic truth, that you can never repay your mother, but the rueful admission that when she took the two-toned lanyard from my hands,

I was as sure as a boy could be that this useless, worthless thing I wove out of boredom would be enough to make us even."

Jacob, from our story today, takes an old rock, and pours oil all over it.

Here you go, God.

It's sweet and all, but... he might as well have given God a lanyard.

You want to hear a dirty little secret? God doesn't actually need us. God doesn't need our lanyards or our greasy old rocks, our prayers or our promises, our worship or our treasures. God doesn't need them, but we need to give them to God. We need to give.

We need to give back to God – with worship and song and poetry and time and tithes and treasures – not because God needs that stuff, but because giving to God *will change us*.
