As Jesus made his entrance into Jerusalem, the whole city was shaken. Unnerved, people were asking, "What's going on here? Who is this?" The parade crowd answered, "This is the prophet Jesus, the one from Nazareth in Galilee."

OUR PROCESSIONAL SONG, "We Are Marching in the Light of God" ("Siyahamba ekukhanyeni kwenkos") is a Zulu chorus that emerged in a rural Protestant congregation, possibly in the former Natal province of South Africa. The chorus probably existed in an oral form for years, although the authors of the melody and of the Zulu lyrics are unknown. The lyrics, with their biblical imagery of walking in the divine light, could be inspired by Methodist or Pentecostal hymnody. Although "Siyahamba" has been associated with the anti-apartheid movement, it was not composed originally as a protest song. However, after its introduction to Europe and the US by Anders Nyberg in the 1980s, it has been used in the international effort to end the regime of racial discrimination in South Africa. Nowadays, "Siyahamba" is viewed both locally and internationally as a liberation song.
